Patient Alert Card for Patients Taking UPLIZNA® (inebilizumab for injection)



You may experience some **particularly serious** side effects when taking UPLIZNA®.

Progressive Multifocal Leukoencephalopathy (PML) is a rare infection of the brain. PML can lead to death or severe disability. It may start with mild symptoms. However, it may get worse over days or weeks. Symptoms of PML can include weakness on one side of the body, changes in vision, confusion, loss of coordination in arms and legs, and changes in thinking, memory, or personality. Seek immediate medical attention if you have one of these symptoms.

Virus infections you had in the past may be reactivated. This may happen if the immune system is weakened. One example of a serious infection is hepatitis B, a liver infection. Prior to initiating treatment, hepatitis B virus screening will be performed. Tell your physician right away about any symptoms of infection.

Serious infections, including urinary tract infections and pneumonia, have been reported in clinical trials. Tell your healthcare provider if you experience symptoms of an infection, such as:

- Stuffy or runny nose
- Sore throat or cough

- · Body aches
- Fever or chills
- · Painful and frequent urination

If you have a troublesome symptom or side effect that is not listed here, talk to your healthcare professional.
